What we collect and why

This website collects information via embedded forms to gather subscribers to our e-newsletter, on our contact form to take enquiries, and, from time to time, to take bookings on events we run.

We may collect the following information. Name, job title, and contact information (address, phone number and email). Additionally, specifically for events, we will also request any relevant medical conditions and emergency contact information – this is in order to be able to provide adequate health and safety measures at our events.

This website uses cookies, we use Google Analytics so that we can track the numbers of visitors we have. Only by our seeing this information, can we strive to improve our website for visitors. What we collect and why – landowner specific data

In addition to the above, our Farm Engagement team may also use platforms such as SurveyMonkey to collect data from farmers, landowners and community groups. In addition to the above mentioned categories of data, the Farm Engagement team may also collect spatial data including SBI numbers for land holdings and any associated grants on those land holdings.

Our team collect this additional information in order to appropriately advise farmers on their eligibility for grant funding; whether that is through the Farming in Protected Landscapes programme or any other funding stream. It also allows the team to provide bespoke land management advice.

Your data may be uploaded onto LandApp or ESRI's ArcMap software. The farm engagement team use this software to create maps for farmers, landowners and community groups. These maps may be submitted with funding applications to Local Assessment Panels.
